





 - HS2 Action Alliance affiliation
 - Registered for Bucks CC summit meetings
 - Many other activities planned



Action Group Aims

- Create a recognisable group to represent the views of all the people of Speen and surrounding areas.
- Provide a focal point for information gathering and dissemination
- Coordinate and support individuals and other campaign organisations, such as The Chiltern Society, HS2 Action Alliance, Chiltern Conservation Board and Buckinghamshire County Council
- Articulate the flaws in the environmental and business case for HS2
- Ensure all those affected as a result of blight are adequately compensated



Action Group Strategy

Tier 1 - overall viability of the HS2 project.

Support a nation al campaign to discredit the business and environmental cases

Promote alternatives which deliver results without HS2

Tier 2 - do not route through the Chilterns

If HS2 cannot be totally defeated, explore and promote alternative routes through existing corridors.

• Tier 3 - do not use Route 2.5

If all of these arguments fail, the final tier is that we may eventually end up 'fighting' against the current preferred route.



The Political Dimension

- HS2 is as much a political fight as an economic and environmental one
 - GB Ltd must have a high speed rail network because everyone else has one
- The business and environment cases are essential tools to create sufficient public opinion to change the 'political' mind
- Lidington, Bercow, Gillan and Grieve are now all members of the Government

- Speen Area Action Group is a member




High Speed 2 Action Alliance



Chiltern Society

- Covers an area twice the size of AONB
- Has 6,500 members
- 5 workstreams active on HS2
 - Challenging the remit to HS2
 - Business case
 - Alternative solutions
 - Geological arguments (water)
 - Environment and noise damage

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Budget 2010

This Budget confirms the establishment of Infrastructure UK (IUK) to lead work within HM Treasury to enable greater private sector investment in infrastructure, and improve the Government's long-term planning and delivery. In the autumn, the Government will publish a national infrastructure plan that will set out goals for UK infrastructure.

This will include priority public and private sector investments and proposals for delivering and supporting investment on a cross-sector basis. IUK will also carry out an investigation into how to reduce the cost of delivery of civil engineering works for major infrastructure projects.

This will be chaired by Terry Hill (Chair of Transport Market, Arup).



Budget 2010

 This Budget announces that the 2010 Spending Review will be published on 20 October 2010. An engagement programme will launch on 24 June 2010, giving public sector workers and members of the public an opportunity to feed in their ideas for how to reduce spending while protecting the quality of public services.



Just remember

- Forget what it will look like when it's done
- 7 10 years of construction
 - Road closures and congestion
 - Dust & dirt (do not hang washing out!)
