## Speen photo-workshop; a brief history



The Speen photo-workshop came into being in June 2009 and was prompted by an idea by Kate Laughton following the Speen Festival; Kate approached Martin Hart who together with his wife Glenn, had helped put together a second successful photography competition for the festival, suggesting to him to run a photo/camera workshop, which he did. 'It's popularity was apparent' said Martin, 'a number of contestants were extremely enthusiastic with the idea'.

The philosophy of the group is to meet with likeminded enthusiasts on a regular basis, and to undertake projects which allow the photographers, not only to extend their knowledge of the camera and photography in general, but to begin to question what makes a good image, and the power of composition and balance. Each project has a subject or task that is approached creatively. There are no competitions and no divisions based on ability.

Some of the original group members have dropped out and changed over the years; at present there are nine regulars. Each member brings to the group an original and personal view of how they see images, and this is apparent when we see such divergent images of the same project.

**Missing Names.** In issue 60 of the SNDN we said that, in 1918, nine men from Speen were serving in the Labour Corps or its equivalent. We gave the names of the two who served on comparable duties, but not those of the seven in the main Corps. They were all Privates: Joseph Bowler; Dudley Frank Bristow; Arthur John Brown; Alfred and Lawrence Harry Gibbons; William Janes and Cecil Ridgley. Most of these men had brothers in the front line Regiments, why did they not join them? They might have been selected for the Labour Corps because of their physique - or for a more interesting reason. The pre-war Army tried hard to put brothers into the same Regiment, but, after the catastrophe of the Somme, the policy was changed. Brothers were still enlisted into the same Regiment but were put into different Battalions - so the likelihood of a family losing several sons in the same engagement was greatly reduced. Later, the Army often went even further and divided brothers between different Regiments.

**Peter Hill.** In the same article we said that Harold Stanley Austin and Leslie Walter Austin were both serving in the Royal Navy. They gave their address as "Peter Hill, Speen". We asked if anyone knew where that was. We are grateful to Ian Menzies-Conacher; he lives in St Peter's Close and his original conveyancing documents (before the modern development) refer to the site as 'land adjacent to St Peter's Hill'. Bravo Ian.



### Weavers and Spinners.

People have asked us if we knew what had happened to the Speen Weavers and Spinners sign. We had no idea, but, by chance, one of us met the new owner of the cottage on Studridge Lane. He confirmed that the repair and restoration of the sign was

well under way but that the workshop had said there was no point in rushing the job as the site was not yet ready to receive it. As you can see from the photo, this much-loved feature of our village was in need of some TLC.

The hand at the top reflects the symbol that is carved on the gravestone of Eric Gill. Presumably there was some association with his artists' community at Pigott's Hill. Does anyone know about that?

**Pigotts Hill.** In August, we organised a walk around the house and grounds at Pigotts in North Dean. Nick Wheeler-Robinson kindly took 21 of us on a fascinating tour of the woods. He pointed out various natural features such as swallow holes, venerable trees - and evidence of squirrel damage and also artefacts of man such as charcoal pits, ancient boundary ditches and a copy of an Eric Gill cross. Returning to the farm, he told us about the history of the house with particular reference to the time of Eric Gill - such a colourful character. This is the second Pigotts tour that we have arranged and their popularity is undiminished; perhaps you would like to join us if we repeat it? (This paragraph is set in Perpetua, one of Eric Gill's most successful typefaces; it is named after his eldest daughter.)

"Best of Speen". We are running a "Best of Speen" photographic competition. We are looking for pictures that record the heritage and character of Speen; this could include landscapes, buildings, architectural features, gardens, wildlife, activities or people - anything that reflects well on the village. Ideally, the best twelve photos would be incorporated into a calendar for 2016. Please send as many images as you wish to John@SpeenBucks.org.

We have been established for several years and have organised talks, walks and displays and have researched and recorded articles on a variety of subjects. The Market was a great success with a record number of people attending who found unique gifts and enjoyed a drink or the special menu whilst helping to raise £3,077 of vital funds for the local hospices.

#### Cardiac Arrest in Rural Villages

The Rural Community Defibrillator Group has been recently set up with the aim to provide an accessible defibrillator for those villages where access to early intervention would significantly improve the chances of recovery from cardiac arrest. Villages such as Speen and Saunderton have been identified through recent tragic events but it is felt that others such as Lacey Green and Hampden would also benefit. At present the

nearest accessible defibrillator for Speen is sited at the Hughenden Valley Surgery with nothing available outside surgery hours.

Rural locations such as Speen and Saunderton are sometimes difficult for ambulances to respond to a patient within the target time of 8 minutes. Statistically with the use of CPR together with a defibrillator, chances of survival from cardiac arrest improves from 1 in 10 to 4 in 10. It is the aim of the project to provide defibrillators in strategic locations so that on ringing 999 the Ambulance Service can assess the situation and, if appropriate, give the location and access code of the device to the caller, staying on the phone to give support and full instructions.

It is hoped that this initiative will meet with local approval as none of this can be done without your help. Each machine costs in the region of £1,400 so funding is very important. The group is already approaching the relevant Members of Local and District and County Councils for funding but individual help will also be needed with fund raising appeals. Without these facilities no change is possible; with them lives may be saved.

## District Council News – November 2014



By the time you read this, everyone should have received and hopefully enjoyed the latest edition of Wycombe District Times, which provides a timely update on all of the schemes being implemented across the District – of which there are many! I can take no credit at all, but it was great to see the 2015 Speen Festival mentioned on Page 11.

Although it is too early to release any details, very positive discussions are taking place with a number of companies who are keen to occupy the new office facilities planned for the wider Handy Cross site, some of which will occupy the space vacated by the current sports centre when it is demolished. This is excellent news as these developments will create even more local jobs and further stimulate the District economy.

In the last issue of SNDN, I outlined the implementation of the new Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) system for parking across the District. I know many local people use the car parks in Princes Risborough and there have been some initial teething problems, such as with the cameras missing some vehicles and also more recently some glare issues with the screen. These are all being worked on and WDC is confident that these early hiccups can be resolved: operation in the various other car parks across the district is now running smoothly.

One key change which requires some getting used to is that with ANPR, payment is made as you leave the car park (if you want to pay there and then instead of online, for example) rather than when you arrive. This has caused a little confusion at first, but experience from around the District and elsewhere in the country suggests that people quickly adjust.

Some readers may know that I have been campaigning to secure funds for an improved broadband service – specifically from the Hampden Row exchange – and it now looks as if around £900,000 should be available across the District. This is unfortunately around half what we were hoping for, as Buckinghamshire County Council, who originally intended to contribute, had to withdraw funding.

Sadly, I can't make any promises about when Hampden Row will be upgraded: the amount we have for the entire District is quite small, and believe it or not, there are areas where the broadband is even worse than here, so I am working the process to see what we can achieve. I

will provide a further update when I can.

Although not a District Council matter, several people have mentioned to me the large number of small power outages we have suffered recently. Recipients of the "Village Messenger" email may already have noted that when there are power cuts, there is no point calling the company you pay for your electricity, as the supply infrastructure is the responsibility of UK Power Networks in our area. They can be contacted on 0800 783 8866 to report a fault, the majority of which are caused by stormy weather or by branches coming into contact with overhead cables.

Power cuts, even short ones, can be quite disruptive but unfortunately there is not a great deal that can be done to avoid them, although if you are aware of any issues with overhanging branches or other potential hazards to the supply network, call UK Power Networks and let them know.

One final point which might help – if you don't already have one, get hold of an "old-fashioned" corded phone. Modern cordless phones generally don't work if you have a power cut, whereas even with no electricity, a corded phone should do.

As you might guess, being a dairy farm, we have been hit hard by the average 20% drop in the price of milk. At last the government are taking some notice and have asked one of their many committees to look into the problem but few farmers have any confidence in the outcome. The current situation will force many smaller dairy farmers out of business, which is of course not in anybody's long term interests. All the supermarkets admit they are selling milk as a lost leader. This devalues milk as a product, but none of them are willing to be the first to raise the price to a realistic level.




Cows relaxing on bank in North Dean

On a global scale, there have been no catastrophic weather events anywhere in the world this year which has enabled dairy farmers worldwide to increase production dramatically, creating an imbalance between supply and demand. The sanctions on Russia have resulted in the loss of a major cheese market, and the Chinese have stopped buying milk powder as they have already built up large stocks of it. Industrialists can turn production off at times like this, but sadly we do not have this option, as cows will not stop milking and then start again just when required!! We monitor costs very carefully, but nearly always come back to increasing production as the only way to cover the reduction in income, which just prolongs the problem!

Politics is at the root of another of the problems of food producer's (particularly in Europe). Herr Juncker has just dismissed his chief scientific advisor, Prof. Anne Glover, because she is in favour of the use of genetically modified crops. Being "pro GM" is not accepted by many of the non scientific community, but to feed the 9 billion people expected on our planet in 2050 we have to accept we have to use all the tools that are available which will include GM, sprays and fertilisers. Nearly all sprays and fertilisers are products of fossil fuels in one form or another, the supply of which is finite, so by adopting its current position (ie anti GM) the

EU risks entering a scientific back water and reducing their options for the future. The majority of the rest of the world is making use of GM crops, but no Frankenstein foods have appeared and there have been no prosecutions for side effects in the decades since they were first introduced.

Beard is rapidly becoming a worse problem than Japanese Knotweed and Himalayan Balsam. Cattle and sheep enjoy eating this Wild Clematis, and in doing so controlling its growth, but since grazing animals have largely disappeared from the fields, our hedgerows are being strangled; Clematis is very difficult to kill as it roots down wherever it touches the ground and it seems very resistant to the usual sprays. We would be delighted to hear from anyone who has a remedy.

#### Wildlife Watch

The late summer period tends to be relatively quiet from a wildlife point of view. However in my own garden my bird table is suddenly coming back to life after several very quiet months and overhead autumn movements of large numbers of birds are apparent. Huge flocks of Woodpigeons have passed over and winter Redwings and Fieldfare from Iceland and Scandinavia have been seen on migration. The autumn crop of berries has already been significantly depleted and the apple crop that many of these birds depend on has been very poor this year. In village gardens and the orchard in Moses Platt Lane where these birds usually feed very few windfalls are apparent. It is likely they will fly further south as a result.

On the bird table Great Spotted Woodpeckers, Nuthatches, Bullfinches, Goldfinches and various tits have re-appeared. Our resident birds of prey have been noted regularly. As well as the Red Kites that are constantly visible Buzzards have been seen regularly and Sparrowhawks have been recorded overhead and also at kills in several gardens in Abbotswood. A small male made a successful kill at our bird table in July taking a juvenile Blue Tit. The female Sparrowhawk is however significantly larger than the male and will concentrate on larger prey like Woodpigeons and Collared Doves. Keith Rosling sent me photographs of a female ripping apart a Woodpigeon in Abbotswood and Jean Whitehouse has reported the same from her garden. (If you witness a kill I would appreciate a phone call to try to come and photograph it. If undisturbed the birds will regularly stay with the prey for 15-20 minutes.) Tawny Owls have been seen and heard regularly in the woods calling both at night and during the day. Young birds were heard in Flowers Bottom calling for food near the Old Plow in late summer. Unfortunately one of our local birds was found dead by Leslie Thompson on Hampden Road in late October. (They are often dazzled by headlights and are not fast flyers so allow them time to move if you spot one at prey on the road.)

The local Mandarin Ducks which have bred successfully in the area seem to be doing well. Some of these birds winter on our woodland ponds. I have recorded 6-7 together whilst Jeremy Symondson has reported 13-15+ of these birds at one location. What is remarkable is how difficult it can be to spot the glamorously coloured birds on the woodland floor. The bold juvenile Heron that was mentioned in my last report is still visiting gardens right in the heart of the village with the most recent report being from Anne Foster next to the shop.

Some interesting local records have been made by Bucks Bird Club members around Great Hampden. Four Ravens were recorded in late August and these have also been noted in Prestwood. The same recorder also noted 4 Firecrests and 2 Siskins in Great Hampden on the same visit. (Firecrests are similar to the tiny Goldcrests that are seen regularly but are less common and have a pronounced white stripe above the eye.) Another observer had a flock of 90 Linnets in September.

Local wood mice and other mammals will soon be seeking out local lofts for the winter. Local Glis glis (Edible Dormice) spend much of the year in our lofts in the village but many residents never see these animals. A visit to the barns at Piggotts in North Dean provides a good opportunity to see these mammals. During an evening Heritage Group tour several appeared overhead on the rafters quite unconcerned about the audience below and came down beams to within a few feet of people. Meanwhile in our own kitchen at home Corinne found one eating at our fruit bowl at about 9.00pm, one night in October. Other residents of local lofts, which cause no damage, include various bats. Pipistrelles are probably the most commonly found species but we also have Long Eared Bats. Alastair Blundell found a dead specimen outside his house in Moses Platt in late September. I mentioned in my previous report about losses of local Roe deer in road accidents and it takes a time for the population to recover from these incidents so numbers remain very small at present.

My main garden pond has gradually recovered from the impact of having Mallard with 7-11 chicks present during the breeding season. However the young ducks became very adept at catching newts and other pondlife. The Grass Snake who was present for the early part of the year was not seen after the summer and may have moved away to seek more food. Jane Oury called to say that she had a large snake outside her front door in the late summer. It sounded as if it was a Grass Snake that had been resting after catching a large frog, which then disappeared down a drain at the front of her cottage, near the chapel, when it was disturbed.

Please let me know of any interesting sightings in both Speen and North Dean.
