Comments

• The key features of the year are both higher than usual expenditure (mower, field, pavilion and play equipment maintenance etc..) and excellent results in our fund raising (Draw, Bonfire night, Funday and tree cycle). Overall, although our expenditure has been significantly higher than income, we have achieved a great deal both in terms of maintenance and projects and our finances remain in good shape.

- As mentioned it has been a successful year for fund raising.
 - The Bonfire figures above (which are a record achievement) require some explanation. £4,375 is shown as the profit on this year's event. This does not take into account the fact that we prepaid £600 in fye 2022 but does include additional cost of the insurance payment of £484, for last year's event, which only came through early this year.. Additionally it should be noted that we have now pre-paid £1,500 for next year's fireworks.
 - The draw income continues to be a very important income stream. Net income from the draw has grown again this year, with more coming direct through bank payments than cash.. We are once again very grateful to all villagers who take part in the draw. Our thanks go to Cristina Delgado and her collection team for their fantastic effort both in collection and in making the process more efficient and secure.
 - The Christmas Tree Recycling has had another great year. Thanks go to all who supported that, especially to Pete Symonds, Duncan Wilson and Jo Allan who provided the ecological recycling space, tree transportation and bacon sandwiches respectively.
 - Although the Fun Day is not meant to be a fund raiser, thanks to excellent food and bar provision, this
 year it has made a significant contribution.
- As noted above It has been a big year for expenditure on maintenance and improvement of all aspects of the Playing Fields and Ridgeley's field. In addition to the usual grass cutting and maintenance of play equipment the main projects have been:-
 - Complete refurbishment of the electrics in the pavilion, bringing us up to current standards and best practise.
 - Purchase of a new (to us) mower.
 - Completion of the roundabout project which has left us with a vintage asset in first class working order.
 - Repairs to the bike park and maintenance of Ridgeley's field.
 - o Purchase and planting of a new Christmas tree
 - Training of 4 trustees to be first aiders



- Following partnering with the Speen School PTA to provide food for the bonfire night event, SPF made a donation to the PTA funds to help them upgrade their own play equipment.
- We have not invoiced the Tennis Club for their rental/maintenance over the past couple of years. We are currently in discussion with them about this, with the anticipation of c£800 coming into our account soon.
